

It is woven predominantly on a loin loom but also, occasionally woven on a frame loom or a Zo loom. The weaving in the loin loom is done in two parts and the fabric is later stitched together. The traditional way of wearing a puan is to wrap it around oneself from the waist to the ankle. The length of the puan is normally 60" –65". It takes 7 days or more to finish a plain puan, month or more for patterned puan on a loin loom. Puan with a red horizontal section in the middle is generally used in wedding, festival and during traditional dances. Earlier puan was of cotton, which was partially replaced by acrylic and nowadays, fly shuttle frame looms/zo- looms are used to weave puans using silk yarn also. In the photograph, the puan is woven with Mulberry silk (dyed) in warp & weft, dyed), extra weft for motives using Art Silk and mercerised Cotton. Name of the design is Lenbuangthuam&Disul (traditional name).

However, by incorporating contemporary design, it has become a fashionable wear of most of Northeast women. It is woven predominantly on a loin loom but also, occasionally woven on a frame loom or a Zo loom. The weaving in the loin loom is done in two parts and the fabric is later stitched together. The traditional way of wearing a puan is to wrap it around oneself from the waist to the ankle. The length of the puan is normally 60" – 65". It takes 7 days or more to finish a plain puan, a month or more for patterned puan on a loin loom. Cottonyarn is used for main fabric where coloured acrylic thread is used for making the design part.

Art Silk yarn has been used in extra weft. To weave a Stole, it takes about 3-4 days. It is narrow width fabric worn around the shoulders by women.

To weave, a piece of this shawl, it takes about 4-5 days. It is large piece of fabric, generally draped over the shoulders.

It takes 2-3 weeks to finish a 'senior design' puan, and 7 days for plain puan.Raw Materials used: 2/40s Cotton or Acrylic
